1. Is there any such movement to upgrade the building codes to provide such forward-looking residential infrastructure?

Yes- there is a statewide coalition of environmental and business organizations that are working to provide education and logistical support to communities interested in updating their building codes and moving towards a gas-free future! While we've been primarily focused on the City and County of Denver, should there be interest in engaging in Longmont, we'd be happy to help!

2. Are there any cities that require landlords to remove and replace gas stoves?

Unfortunately not at this time. However, cities do have the power to pass policy aimed at retrofitting existing buildings. It's important to note that while gas stoves are a major source of indoor air pollution- they're not the **only** source of indoor air pollution. Other appliances in your home that may use gas include the furnace, water heater, and possibly dryer.
